PORTFOLIO MANAGEMENT INSIGHTS

- Equities ended the second quarter of 2019 in positive territory, but trade and slowing global growth are still areas of concern for the market and economy. Markets are anticipating that the Fed will remain accommodative and cut rates in July. The Hancock Horizon Quantitative Long/Short Fund (Investor Class) returned 1.40% for the quarter, outperforming the HFRX Equity Hedge Index which returned 0.02%, but trailed the S&P 1500 which returned 4.16%.
- Small cap stock returns, while positive, lagged large cap returns and did not contribute positively to our multi-cap strategy. Stock selection in Industrials and Healthcare were positive contributors to performance for the quarter, while stock selection in Consumer Discretionary and Utilities detracted from performance.
- The net long equity position of the Fund increased slightly to approximately 62% by the end of the quarter. With monetary policy seemingly becoming more accommodative around the world, stocks could continue to see positive momentum throughout the year barring any exogenous shocks. Although US economic indicators are showing little sign of a recession in the near term, we remain cautious given the real possibility that we are in the latter innings of the current US market cycle and are mindful of the potential deceleration in corporate earnings growth. We continue to monitor general market conditions for opportunities as this strategy remains flexible to adapt to changing market dynamics.

While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. HHQAX and HHQTX were rated against 206 Long/Short Equity funds over a three-year period and 131 funds over a five-year period and 33 over a 10 year period. With respect to these funds, HHQTX and HHQAX received a rating of 2 stars for the three-year period, 3 stars for the five-year period and 4 stars for the 10 year period.
